Guidelines and Criteria

Navarro supports and encourages educational initiatives. Through our Community Commitment Grants Program, we focus on growing the next generation of workers for the [Nevada National Security Site](#) and on improving the educational experience in our local schools.

We are now accepting applications for our 2024 Community Commitment Grants Program. We designed the program to recognize and support excellence in teaching by providing funds for specific projects or curricula in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). While all teachers from eligible schools are welcome to apply, grant award preference will be focused on STEM-based applications. So, for instance, a music teacher might apply for a grant based on a math-related project within the field of music.

Application Process

- Application is available on the Navarro website. (<https://navarro-inc.com/navarro-community-commitment-grants-program/>)
- Grant eligibility is open to public, private, and charter schools in the counties of Clark, Elko, Esmeralda, Lincoln, Nye, and White Pine in Nevada. Eligibility is based on the affected communities near the Nevada National Security Site and/or include U.S. Department of Energy radioactive waste transportation routes in Nevada.
- There is \$10,000 available for STEM-based projects or curricula this round.
- More than one teacher from a school may apply, but the school principal must approve each application.
- Proposals must be submitted by email using the PDF application form.
- **Deadline to submit is 5:00 p.m. PT on October 18, 2023.** (applications received after this time will not be considered.)

Selection Committee and Process

- All identifying information will be removed from the applications before Navarro's Community Commitment Planning Committee (CCPC) reviews to ensure an objective selection process.
- Each application will be assigned an identifying number for tracking.
- After review, members of CCPC will rank the numbered applications that could be fully or partially funded, or not approved for funding.
- Navarro reserves the right to make the final determinations on all grant awards.

Selection Criteria

1. Project summary (maximum of 700 words): Description of the project and expected results.
2. Learning outcomes (maximum of 300 words): The top three learning objectives/curriculum concepts.
3. Evaluation (maximum of 500 words): How project results will be measured (Navarro requires awardees to submit photos, where possible, of students engaged in the project).
4. Validation (maximum of 500 words): How the project supports STEM and why it is deserving of the grant.
